President's Message

It was a good year for the Chess Federation of Canada. There were many positive factors that helped make this possible. The most important one was the financial bottom line. We have gone from a deficit to a small surplus. This is very significant, and Governors and members alike should be very pleased with this turnaround. The office staff deserve credit for helping to keep the lid on expenses. However, part of this recovery was due to one time expense reductions, therefore, we must continue to be vigilant in our financial affairs and build on this impressive performance.

The school program continues to expand, and this is another important factor. As more children become aware of our organization, it helps increase the sale of chess supplies and gives a base from which to build future C.F.C. memberships. This year we organized the Youth Chess Championships for the first time and

it was a very successful event. There were 102 top junior players in Vancouver at the finals enjoying the city, the excellent playing site, and the competition. Next year promises to be even bigger and better.

Getting sponsorship for our National programs is always difficult; however, this year we were able to persuade one company to give some financial support to the Olympic team. On the subject of sponsorship and funding, I have written to the Federal Government and included the articles on English M.P. Charlotte Atkins' campaign to have chess recognized as a sport. Although governments in the past have shown little regard for chess, times are changing and perhaps the atmosphere is becoming more conducive to influence Members of Parliament in a positive way.

As we look toward the future, I am optimistic that we can continue to grow and get stronger. The emphasis will be on sales and youth chess. Budgeting for our financial decisions

will also be very important. Most of all though, we need Governors and members working together to help build our organization. Positive suggestions that are designed to aid the C.F.C. should be explored, even if we initially disagree on the paths they take us on. This is in direct contrast to remarks that are made whose sole purpose is to criticize or be negative.

The Executive are committed to building an efficient and strong organization to benefit all its members. The coming year will provide new challenges and demands. I am confident that with the Executive, Governors and members aiding the cause and working on behalf of our organization wherever possible, we will be able to have another successful year. I wish all of our members a very enjoyable year in chess.

A Curious Omission

In my article on Carroll, I should have mentioned Ivor Davies' "Looking-Glass Chess" (1970), which argues that the lack of alternation of turns in the chess game and the

leaving of the White King in check can be accounted for by examining certain defunct rules that Carroll was aware of from chess literature he owned. My difficulty with Davies' approach is his failure to get past the notion that the game is conducted either between a White player and a Red player, or by "the casting of unseen dice by an invisible chess master" (191). These observations should not be considered as conclusions in themselves, which Davies appears content to make them, but as a means of digging deeper into the implications of the chess game. In addition, Davies makes no real effort to interpret the significance of the chess game with respect to what it suggests about the metaphorical nature of Alice's dream-journey.

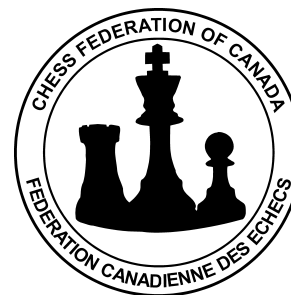

The Gothenburg Bust

by Dale Kirton

Thanks to former World Champion Robert Fischer the Gothenburg Variation of the Najdorf Sicilian is often dubbed the drawing variation. Black has many alternative paths in the Najdorf: The Poisoned Pawn, the Browne System, the Classical Main Line, the Polugaevsky, and a wealth of subsystems in which White has to be well versed in order to tackle the beast.

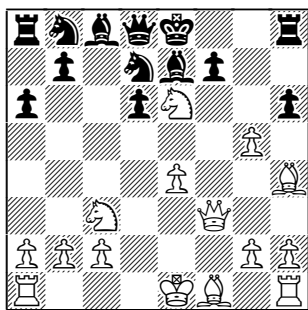

The so-called Gothenburg Variation, played in three games in round 14 of the 1955 Gothenburg Interzonal by three Argentinian players, each against a Soviet opponent, viz. Spassky–Pilnik, Geller–Panno, and Keres–Najdorf.

This knight sacrifice is the most promising continuation in this position, and in this article we will not discuss White's alternatives.

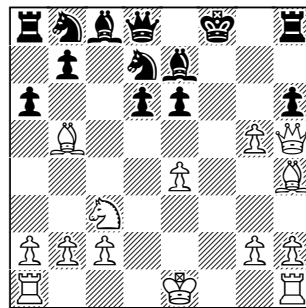
In his new *NCO* opening reference, John Nunn gives 11.♙h5 as the main line of the Gothenburg, even though this is now clearly second best, and includes 11.♗xe6 as a note up to 17...♙f6. He then gives the faulty 18.♖f1 an (!) and continues with

18...axb5 19.e5 ♙xe5. In *New In Chess Yearbook 48* I gave 19...♗g5! as a convincing refutation. Nunn also still gives 17...♗xf7 as a draw after 18.gxf7+ ♖xf7 19.♖f1+ ♗f6 20.♙h7+ ♖f8 21.♙h8+ and perpetual check. He must not have had time to include my *New In Chess* analysis before the deadline of his own book. This is all he gave on the Gothenburg, and it is all wrong!

It is said that Geller lead the way with 13.♗b5 and when the Argentinians didn't like the way Panno's position looked, went another route. But Panno's way held out the most hope if followed by 13...♖h7. But who knew this at the time now known as the Argentinian Disaster!

This move was first discovered by Keres. Bobby Fischer utilized it to gain his Grandmaster title against Gligoric, Portoroz 1958. There is a great anecdote of Fischer and Gligoric on a walk about a week before their game. Fischer asked Gligoric what he knew about the Gothenburg variation, and Gligoric replied: "Nothing"!

Canadian Open Chess Championship

This year's summer blockbuster chess event took place in Richmond, British Columbia. Peter Stockhausen and crew once again put on a first-class show that attracted just over 200 players to the Delta Pacific Conference and Resort Centre for the ten day event. Pre-tournament favorite Kevin Spraggett was joined by fellow GM Eduard Gufeld, IMs Georgi Orlov, Tom O'Donnell, Anthony Saidy and David Cummings, as well as a host of other strong contenders including Jack Yoos, Irwin Lipnowski, and others from as far away as Europe and South America. Notable was the large number of strong and talented junior players in attendance, most of whom had just completed play in the Canadian Youth Chess Championships, reported on elsewhere in this issue.

In the battle for supremacy Kevin Spraggett captured the early lead and never relinquished his seat on board one for the duration of the event.

Georgi Orlov, the only player to match Kevin's impressive 9.5/11 tally, had a somewhat easier schedule after losing to IM Anthony Saidy in round five.

One of the most notable performances in the event was turned in by NM Nenad Ristic, whose 2477 performance rating and 8.5/11 score left him in unshared fourth place. His victim in the last round was NM Marcel Milat, who had also had a successful event.

Canadian Youth Chess Championship

The first Canadian Youth Chess Championships were held in Vancouver from July 1–3 at the Delta Pacific Resort and Conference Centre under the auspices of the Chess Federation of Canada, just prior to the start of the Canadian Open.

101 young and talented players competed in five sections — the Under 18, Under 16, Under 14, Under 12 and Under 10 — and produced clear winners in all categories, who will now go on to represent Canada at the World Youth Championships in Spain! The national finals were the culmination of this year's qualifying competitions that attracted nearly 1,500 kids from across the country, of whom just over 50% were newcomers to organized chess competition!

Next year's event, once again to be held in conjunction with the Canadian Open in Edmonton, Alberta, should prove to be even bigger and better. The Chess Federation of Canada plans to continue to devote considerable resources to the development and organization of youth chess at all levels, and would like to see this event grow into the biggest annual chess competition in Canada!

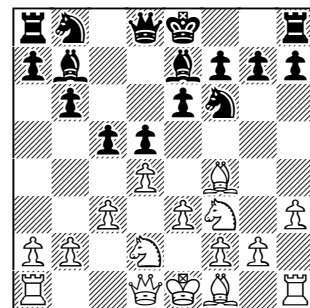

This is a mistake. Immediately after I made this move, I discovered what White's best reply would be.

Relief! Instead 8.dxb8! was best, followed according to Fritz5 by 8...xb8 9.a4+ f8 10.d3 c4 11.c2 e8 12.xe8+ xe8. Fritz5 thinks this is only slightly better for White, but I disagree.

White's best plan is to build in the center with de5 and dxf3. Black in turn will try to open the center to increase the scope of his d/b7, or begin play against White's queenside with ...a6 and ...b5-b4.

10.dxc5?!

This decreases White's control of the center and plays into Black's hands.

10...dxc5 11.c4

White further opens the position, thus turning d/b7 into a monster.

11...xc8 12.de5 dxc4

Fritz5 gives this as slightly better for Black.

The only good moves for White are 16.d4 or 16.dxf3.

Now White loses a pawn to a simple tactic.

Vancouver Keres Memorial

The 24th Paul Keres Memorial was held at the Royal Centre Hotel & Casino in New Westminster, British Columbia from May 21–24. Highlighted by International Masters **Yan Teplitsky** and **Georgi Orlov**, the event attracted 105 players, which is the largest turnout since the Robson Square Media Centre days.

The tournament featured the usual "spills and thrills" associated with this event dating back to the 1975 Vancouver International, which was Paul Keres' last tournament. Several old-time players re-emerged after several years of inactivity, including former BC Closed participant Tony Pacuzzi. The tournament was also visited on Sunday by GMs Yasser Seirawan and Duncan Suttles, FM Bruce Harper, as well as 1951 BC Champion Maurice Pratt. One spectator noted that between the latter three and the four former BC Champions playing in the tournament there were a total of seven past champions present!

The tournament ended in a three way tie between Orlov, Teplitsky and **Jack Yoos**, all at 6/7. David Herder, Gilbert Sommerfeld and John Hallam won Top U2300 honors at 5/7, while Samuel Wong took Top U2200 with a notable 4.5/7 performance. The Reserve Section was won by **Steve Fowler** with 6/6 and the Booster Section by **Michael Becherer** and Cadet **Valentina Goutor** at 5/6.
