First Meeting

Alexandre Muller | Age: 29 | World No. 133 | Career-High No. 38 | 2026: 4-12 (Marrakech QF) | Kitzbuhel: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 500 in 2016, Top 250 in 2019, Top 100 in 2023 and achieved career-high No. 38 in August 2025 after advancing to biggest final of career in Rio de Janeiro earlier in the season.
 > Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Hong Kong, becoming 3rd man in Open Era to win a tour-level title by rallying from a set down in all matches played after Ashe at 1975 WCT Finals and Bublik at 2024 Montpellier.
 > Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Musetti en route to 1st SF and final at 2023 Marrakech.
 > Earned Top 10 victories over No. 6 Rublev at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Rome, No. 3 Zverev at 2025 Hamburg and No. 10 Khachanov at 2025 Beijing.
 > Made tour-level debut at 2017 Roland Garros as WC (l. to Monteiro) and won 1st tour-level match at 2021 Australian Open as LL, beating Londero in 1R.
 > Owns 142-124 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning 1st title at 2022 Blois after saving a MP in his 1R match.

NOTE: Muller aims to break a 7-match tour-level losing streak and earn first win since defeating Kopriva in Marrakech 2R in April. He seeks first Top 50 win on clay since defeating No. 3 Zverev at 2025 Hamburg for biggest win of career.

Mariano Navone | Age: 25 | World No. 47 | Career-High No. 29 | 2026: 16-16 (Bucharest Title) | Kitzbuhel: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 200 in June 2023, Top 100 in February 2024 and Top 50 in April 2024, achieving career-high No. 29 in June 2024 after capturing 6th Challenger title in Cagliari.
 > As No. 31 seed at 2024 Roland Garros, became first man in Open Era to be seeded in his Grand Slam main draw debut and defeated former-World No. 10 Carreno Busta in 1R.
 > Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2026 Bucharest, earning deciding set wins in 3 out of 5 matches and saving 2 MPs vs. van de Zandschulp in SF and defeated No. 5 Auger-Aliassime to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 3R at 2026 Rome.
 > Earned 1st ATP Tour win and advanced to 1st QF, SF and final at 2024 Rio de Janeiro as Q and defeated clay-court champions Darderi, Seyboth Wild and F. Cerundolo en route to 2nd final at 2024 Bucharest.
 > On home soil, made his ATP Tour debut at 2024 Cordoba as WC and earned 1st Top 20 win over No. 12 Rune to reach 2025 Buenos Aires QF before squandering 2 MPs vs. eventual champion Fonseca.
 > Posted 40-18 Challenger record in 2023, ending the season on a 19-2 run and led all players with 5 Challenger titles, winning in Poznan, Santa Fe, Santa Cruz, Buenos Aires and Santa Fe-2.

NOTE: Navone earned 15 of his 16 wins this season on clay, highlighted by 1st ATP Tour title in Bucharest and run to Geneva final. He aims to break 4-match losing streak and earn 1st win since defeating Brooksby in Roland Garros 1R.

Lukas Neumayer | Age: 23 | World No. 172 | Career-High No. 157 | 2026: 1-1 (Umag 1R) | Kitzbuhel: 1-3 (2024 2R)
 > Achieved career-high No. 157 in August 2025 soon after breaking into Top 200 in April that year.
 > Qualified to make ATP Tour debut at 2021 Kitzbuhel as 980th-ranked QWC and defeated countryman Ofner to earn his first ATP Tour win at 2024 Kitzbuhel as WC.
 > Owns 89-86 Challenger record (1-6 in finals), advancing to 2023 Salzburg, 2023 Cordenons, 2024 Tulln, 2024 Montemar, 2025 Vicenza, and 2025 Cordenons finals before winning his first Challenger title at 2026 Vicenza.
 > Has earned 5 ITF World Tennis Tour titles, capturing latest trophy at 2023 M25 Jablonec and Nisou.
 > Peaked at No. 27 in the juniors, reaching 2020 Roland Garros boys' singles QF (l. to eventual champion Stricker).

NOTE: Neumayer seeks to avenge last year's 1R loss to Hanfmann and earn 2nd ATP Tour win after defeating No. 56 Ofner at this event in 2024 (l. to Moreno de Alboran in 2R). Last week in Umag, he made his first ATP Tour main-draw appearance outside Kitzbuhel (excluding Davis Cup), falling to Prado Angelo in the 1R as a lucky loser.

Yannick Hanfmann | Age: 34 | World No. 52 | Career-High No. 45 | 2026: 17-14 (Santiago F) | Kitzbuhel: 12-7 (2020 Final)
 > Hearing-impaired player broke into Top 100 in 2018 and achieved career-high No. 45 in July 2023 after biggest win of career vs. No. 5 Tsitsipas at 2023 Mallorca en route to 6th of 10 ATP Tour SFs.
 > Earned wins over No. 9 Fritz and No. 6 Rublev to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Rome and as World No. 101 became lowest-ranked quarter-finalist in Rome since No. 114 Monaco in 2016.
 > Qualified en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2017 Gstaad and 2nd final at 2020 Kitzbuhel and defeated No. 19 F. Cerundolo to reach 3rd final at 2026 Santiago.

- > Captured 1st Top 10 win of career over No. 9 Monfils at 2020 Hamburg, where he accepted main draw WC instead of playing qualifying at Roland Garros.
- > Posted 1st Grand Slam main draw win in 7th try at 2022 Australian Open as Q (d. Kokkinakis).
- > Captured 7 Challenger titles after playing for University of Southern California (2012-15), where he helped Trojans win 2 NCAA national titles.

NOTE: Hanfmann is 12-3 in opening rounds in 2026, losing to Jodar at ATP Masters 1000 Miami, Blockx at Munich and Medjedovic at Roland Garros. He leads this year's main draw field in number of Kitzbuhel match wins (12).

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Joel Schwaerzler | Age: 20 | World No. 185 | Career-High No. 169 | 2026: 0-1 (Gstaad 1R) | Kitzbuhel: 0-2 (2024-25 1R)
 > Earned first PIF ATP Rankings point at age 17 in March 2023 before breaking into Top 500 in May 2024 and achieving career-high No. 169 in May 2026.
 > Peaked at No. 1 in juniors in January 2024 after winning 2023 ITF World Tennis Tour Junior Finals, before claiming 2024 Roland Garros in boys' doubles title w/Budkov Kjaer.
 > Owns 54-47 Challenger record, highlighted by 1st title at 2024 Skopje as No. 664-ranked 18-year-old in his 7th Challenger main draw, defeating former-Top 100 player Majchrzak in final and winning 2nd title at 2026 Kigali-1.
 > Made ATP Tour qualifying debut in Kitzbuhel in 2023 before making his ATP Tour main draw debut at the same event in 2024, losing to Seyboth Wild in 1R.

NOTE: Schwaerzler seeks 1st ATP Tour win in his 5th ATP Tour match after making debut at this event in 2024 (l. to No. 72 Seyboth Wild in 1R). 20-year-old aims to become the youngest Austrian to win a match at this event since Thiem (19Y 11M) in 2013.

Jurij Rodionov | Age: 27 | World No. 145 | Career-High No. 87 | 2026: 2-2 (2 times in 1R) | Kitzbuhel: 1-3 (2022 2R)
 > Earned 1st ranking point at age 16 in November 2015, broke into Top 200 in January 2019, into Top 100 in August 2023 and achieved career-high No. 87 in February 2024 after winning 7th Challenger title in Koblenz.
 > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2021 Stuttgart as WC and reached 2nd QF at 2023 Astana as Q.
 > Qualified, saved 1 MP and rallied from 2 sets down vs. Chardy at 2020 Roland Garros to earn 1st tour-level win of career.
 > Also entered Roland Garros as a lucky loser in 2023, losing to former-World No. 10 Pouille in both final round of qualifying and 1R and qualified in 2026 without dropping a set.
 > Owns 8-8 record in Challenger finals, including titles at 2022 and 2023 Biel and most recent title at 2025 Bonn.
 > Peaked at No. 7 in juniors, highlighted by run to 2017 Wimbledon boys' singles QF and boys' doubles final w/Vrbensky.

NOTE: Rodionov is making his 4th appearance at Kitzbuhel, looking to earn 2nd win at the event after defeating Casanova in 1R in 2022 (l. to Bautista Agut in 2R). He seeks first tour-level win outside Davis Cup since defeating Vukic at 2024 Munich 1R (l. to Zverev in 2R).

Vit Kopriva | Age: 29 | World No. 68 | Career-High No. 55 | 2026: 17-15 (Rio de Janeiro SF) | Kitzbuhel: 0-2 ('22, '24 1R)
 > Broke into Top 500 in 2016, Top 200 in 2021, Top 100 in April 2025 and achieved career-high No. 55 in May 2026 after defeating former champion No. 12 Rublev to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 4R in Madrid.
 > Advanced to 2021 Gstaad SF as 249th-ranked Q, joining 2021 Cordoba champion J. Cerundolo as 2nd player since May 2012 to reach SF in his ATP Tour main draw debut.
 > Defeated No. 10 Shapovalov in 2021 Gstaad 2R to become lowest-ranked player to earn Top-10 win since No. 698 Kokkinakis beat No. 6 Raonic at 2017 London/Queen's Club.
 > Did not drop a set en route to 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2026 Rio de Janeiro, losing to eventual champion Etcheverry in second-longest ATP Tour SF (3H 58M) since ATP Tour began recording match times in 1991.
 > Owns 153-110 Challenger record (6-4 in finals), capturing titles at 2022 Prostějov, 2023 Verona, 2023 Tulln, 2024 Szczecin, 2024 Lima-2 and 2025 Naples.

> Former Top-75 junior earned boys' singles wins over future Top-10 ATP players de Minaur and Ruud.

NOTE: Kopriva is seeking first win at the event in his 3rd appearance after losing to Sousa in 2022 and Djere in 2024. He earned 9 out of his 11 Top 50 wins on clay courts (including Challenger level), highlighted by biggest win of career against No. 10 Shapovalov at 2021 Gstaad.

Ignacio Buse | Age: 22 | World No. 35 | Career-High No. 31 | 2026: 15-13 (Hamburg Title) | Kitzbuhel: 0-1 (2025 1R)

> Former Top-10 junior broke into Top 200 in May 2025, Top 100 in January 2026 and Top 50 in May 2026 at career-high No. 31 after winning Hamburg title to become 1st Peruvian ATP Tour champion since Horna in 2007.

> Joined No. 18 Yzaga, No. 29 Arraya and No. 33 Horna as only Peruvians to break into Top 50 in PIF ATP Rankings history.

> Qualified en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2025 Gstaad and defeated Fonseca and former-World No. 6 Berrettini en route to 2026 Rio de Janeiro SF.

> Also qualified for Grand Slam main draw debut at 2025 US Open, becoming fourth Peruvian man to play in Grand Slam main draw in this century after Horna, Miranda and Varillas.

> Owns 58-41 Challenger record (2-2 in finals), winning titles at 2025 Heilbronn - Bad Rapenau and 2025 Seville.

> Peaked at No. 9 in junior rankings in January 2022 and advanced to Roland Garros final and US Open SF with countryman Bueno in boys' doubles later that season.

NOTE: Buse earned 19 of his 23 career tour-level wins on clay courts, highlighted by winning 1st ATP Tour title in Hamburg in May this year. He is making his second appearance at the event after losing to Cazaux in 1R last year.
