WELCOME

On behalf of everyone involved in the delivery of the event, I would like to welcome you to The National Cycling Centre, home of British Cycling and venue for the fourth round of the 2011 UCI Track Cycling World Cup Classics.

It is particularly exciting to be hosting the final round of the series, especially given its added significance as a key qualifying event for the 2012 Olympic Games. This event is an excellent chance to watch many of the Great Britain riders aiming for Olympic glory in 2012, as they test themselves against an outstanding field of international talent, many of whom will be back in the country for London 2012.

British Cycling has developed an excellent reputation for staging World Class events and in recent years the UCI Track Cycling World Cup Classics, UCI Para Cycling World Track Championships and the UCI Cross-Country Mountain Bike World Cup, Yorkshire have all been delivered by our events team. We believe that bringing major events of this calibre to this country makes a significant contribution to the growth of interest in cycling, providing focus for athletes and fans alike.

A record entry suggests that this event's reputation for organisational excellence, plus the unique atmosphere generated by the Manchester crowds, is appreciated by the top teams and riders: similarly, last year's Mountain Bike World Cup was voted best in the series by the world governing body. These are useful benchmarks for British Cycling's events team as they strive to deliver world class events.

We hope you will enjoy working alongside us in bringing this World Cup to the attention of the general public and that the event provides a thrilling and impressive spectacle of track racing at its best.

The information in this media guide is designed to help your coverage of the event. It also includes guidelines intended to ensure that you can do your jobs as effectively as possible.

SECTION 2

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

PARKING

Due to ongoing building work of the new BMX centre, parking for this year's event will be restricted. Therefore, we hope you will be understanding of these complexities and the arrangements we have put in place to try and minimise inconvenience.

If your press accreditation has been accepted by British Cycling, you will have received an email confirming that you have been allocated a car parking pass at the event. Please take a copy of this email with you and give it to the car park attendant in the Media/VIP car park at the National Cycling Centre. They will then give you a parking pass to leave in your vehicle and will direct you accordingly.

Please note: If you don't bring proof of your entitlement to a parking pass, you will be instructed to park in a designated parking area temporarily until you have collected a parking pass from Permanence at the Velodrome.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

We encourage you to use public transport.

By Bus

The No. 216 bus runs every 10 - 15 minutes between Piccadilly Gardens and Ashton, stopping at the Ashton New Road/Alan Turing Way bus stop next to the City of Manchester Stadium. The No. 217 & 218 buses run half-hourly between Shudehill interchange, by the Printworks in Manchester and Staleybridge/Tameside, stopping at Alan Turing Way/Phillips park (next to Macdonalds).

Upon Arrival

When you arrive at the Velodrome for the first time please proceed to the Velodrome reception and follow signs to the permanence. There you will be issued with your accreditation which you will then need to gain access to the media centre.

Media centre

The media centre is located in track centre. Enter through the main reception (Athlete and Media Entrance), follow the corridor down to the opposite end of the building and take the stairs down under the track. The media centre is to your right as you emerge in track centre. It will open one hour before the start of competition each day and close one hour after the final ceremony.

Closing times:

Friday: 23:30pm
Saturday: 12am
Sunday: 6pm

We would ask that you please keep your equipment in this area as tidy as possible so it does not cause obstruction or hazard to other people working in the media centre.

ACCESS/ ACCREDITATION

All media accreditations grant access to the grandstand, the media centre and other designated zone 2 areas. Please bear in mind that this year's round of the World Cup has a record number of people attending the event and it is therefore extremely important that your accreditation is displayed correctly and the zones allocated on your press pass are adhered to.

Accreditation will be tightly controlled and you may be unable to access areas that you have done at previous events.

Event accreditations have been designated according to the UCI categories and we kindly ask that you adhere with stewards and security personnel who have been instructed to follow event procedures with regards to access in the track centre.

Please also bear in mind that you are personally responsible for the safe keeping of your accreditation. If your pass is lost or stolen, please inform the Permanence Manager immediately. There will be a £10 charge for replacing each accreditation.

Please note: There is no reserved media seating in the grandstand and that seating for the event is sold out. In order to ensure that media have excellent photo opportunities from the concourse, an area behind the seats at Blocks K and H have been reserved as photo zones.

Please refer to the Media Centre noticeboard for further details.

INTERNET ACCESS AND POWER POINTS

The media centre is equipped with 50 desks, each with internet access and power points. Media are also welcome to use the concourse where power is also available and wireless is live throughout the building. Please bear in mind that we are expecting an extremely big media turn out and others may also need to use your connections. A wireless internet password was included in an email sent to you about parking instructions for the event.

BIB USAGE

Photographers will be issued with bibs that must be worn at all times when photographing in the venue. Bibs require a £10 deposit, which will be returned when you hand back the bib.

Green bibs are for all working photographers and a limited number of UCI bibs will be allocated for access to the track apron, at the discretion of the press team.

Videographers, cameramen and TV crew will be issued with blue bibs. Flash photography is allowed but please be considerate of competitors when using flash during events.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION CONTINUED

PHOTOGRAPHY ADVICE

Photographers must follow the instructions of race officials at all times. They may limit the number of photographers allowed on the track apron at any one time. In extreme cases they may remove a photographer(s) from the apron. Photographers shooting on the track apron must wear their UCI bib at all times. Photographers on the track apron are responsible for themselves and any consequences of their behaviour. Photographers must also stay within two metres of the inner fence at all times.

Please do not place any equipment on the apron in case a rider needs to exit the track unexpectedly. Tripods are not allowed on the track apron.

Please be aware of what is happening on the track at all times: do not turn your back on the cyclists who will always travel in an anti-clockwise direction on the track.

Please also take care not to impede race officials in their management of the event.

Don't step in front of the infield cameras as the event is being broadcast live on television.

During the Keirin events, please be aware that the derny will exit the track in the back straight with two and a half laps to go.

TV CREWS

Camera crews will be issued with blue bibs. Although a limited amount of competition filming is allowed for atmospherics, rights for continuous filming of the event are restricted to the rights holder for the event.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION CONTINUED

MEDAL CEREMONIES

Medal ceremonies will take place as per the schedule in the programme, although these timings are also subject to change. Photographers may take photographs from behind the roped off area in front of the podium. Please bear in mind that an area in front of the roped off area is reserved for the host broadcaster.

INTERVIEWS

If you would like to interview a rider after an event, please speak to a member of the press team prior to the final race finishing. Interviews will take place in the mix zone (located next to the podium) after riders have conducted their interviews with the event rights holder and event organisers, who are given priority. Please also note riders may be required for anti doping after podium ceremonies.

Please be aware riders might not be available if they are listed to ride in further events in the same session. It is at the discretion of the cyclist and his/her support team as to when (or if) they are available for media interviews.

British Cycling staff are available throughout the event to talk about cycling in Britain. Please ask at the media centre for details.

RESULTS & START LISTS

Start lists for each event will be made available to the media as soon as they are received from the race commissaries in print and at www.tissottiming.com. These will be distributed in the media centre and arranged in order of event.

Please note: In the case of events in which rounds are raced in quick succession results and start lists may not be available prior to the next round commencing – this is particularly likely with keirin and sprint events.

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

See the final pages of this document. Please note, however that this schedule is subject to change. Any changes made will be communicated through the media centre.

ENTRY LISTS

A list of entrants for the GB Cycling team is included in this media guide as a pullout. For a full list of entrants for all teams (including race number, name and nationality) please ask one of our media representatives.

REFRESHMENTS

Coffee, tea and biscuits are available in the media centre throughout each session. The event canteen offers hot meals during the session break on Friday 18 and Saturday 19 February, and on Sunday 20 February from 11:30am – 2:30pm. Sandwiches and other snacks will also be available at any time.

During public sessions, food and drink can be purchased from the concessions in the grandstands.

OFFICIALS' ENCLOSURE

No media may enter the officials' enclosure situated in track centre next to the start/finish line at any time.

TEAM PITS AREAS

No media may enter the individual team pit areas with their accreditation. If you wish to do so, you must be escorted to the team pen area by a member of the press team.

MEDICAL CONTROL

Anti-Doping controls are being conducted at this event. Media are prohibited from entering the Medical Control waiting room and testing area at all times.

SECURITY

Please note: It may not always be possible for staff to be in the media centre, although event officials will always be on hand. No responsibility is taken by the organisers for any equipment or valuables left unattended.

If you have any issues of concern on security or safety please refer them to a member of the press team, who will contact someone accordingly.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION CONTINUED

VENUE EVACUATION

In the event that an evacuation of the building is required, please follow the instructions of the security and stewarding personnel.

Please exit the building calmly and quickly, gathering in the Staff, Media and VIP car park (car park 8). It is very important you do not attempt to remove equipment during an evacuation as this could obstruct and reduce the free flow of people exiting the building.

LOST PROPERTY

Any lost property should be handed in to the nearest steward or to Velodrome reception on the ground floor. The Velodrome reception will keep a record of any property handed in. It will be necessary for a steward to accompany any person without accreditation who wishes to reclaim property from the Velodrome reception.

LOST CHILDREN

Any lost children should be taken to the Velodrome reception on the ground floor. The receptionist will arrange for a PA announcement to be made. It will be necessary for a steward to accompany any person without accreditation who wishes to reclaim a lost child from the Velodrome reception.

FACTS AT A GLANCE

- Busiest Velodrome in the world.
- Open from 8.00am to 10.00pm every day, excluding Bank Holidays.
- Home of British Cycling, the national governing body for the sport.
- GB cycling team base including all support staff.
- Operated by The Velodrome Trust, a not for profit organisation. The Board of Directors of the Trust has representatives from Manchester City Council, Sport England and British Cycling.
- Comprehensive track programme catering for all riders; novice to elite, schoolchildren to senior citizens from 9 years to 79 years.
- Jason Queally, Olympic Kilometre Champion in Sydney 2000, started his career as a track cyclist on one of the Velodrome's taster sessions.
- Hosted three World Track Championships (1996, 2000 and 2008). GB track team won an unprecedented nine gold medals at the Championships in March 2008, a foretaste of the success enjoyed at the Beijing Olympics.
- Also the venue for non-cycling events
- The construction of a unique indoor BMX Centre adjoining the Velodrome is nearing completion and is due to be ready in July 2011. There is no other indoor BMX Centre (on this scale) in the world and it will add another cycling discipline to the appeal of the site.

Track designer Ron Webb OAM

Ron was born in Penshurst, Sydney. At the age of 21 he travelled to Europe to further his cycling career. He lived in Holland and competed in events throughout Europe as an amateur and later as a professional. When he retired from racing, he moved to England, and became the promoter of the Skol London 6 day race, held at Wembley between 1968-80 and was also a Race Director in Denmark and Germany. He also became a prolific track designer and track builder. His website illustrates many examples. Manchester Velodrome was built in 1993, and opened in 1994. The track has constant use, in excess of any other cycle track in the world. Due to damage and discolourisation the surface was renewed in 2007.

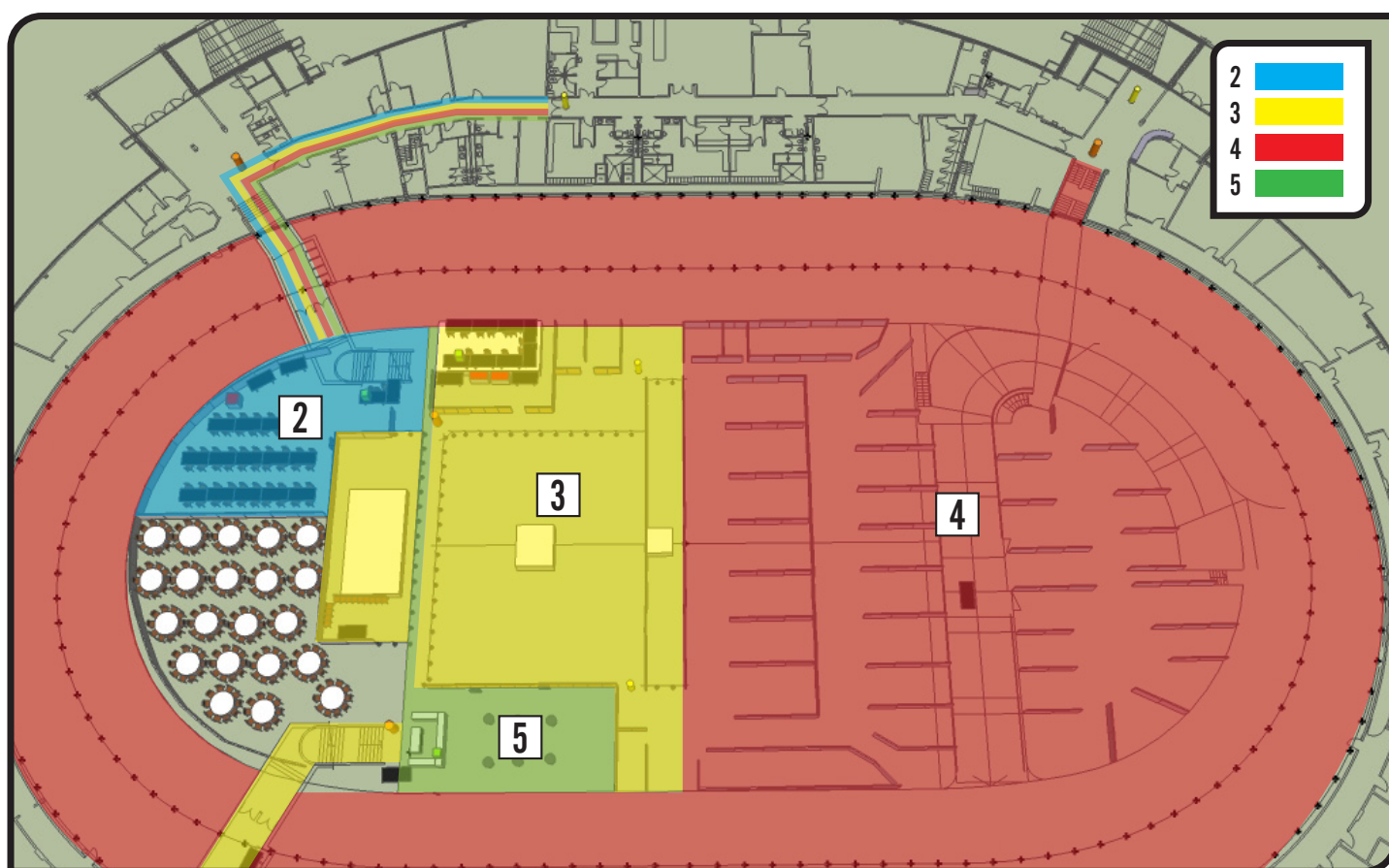

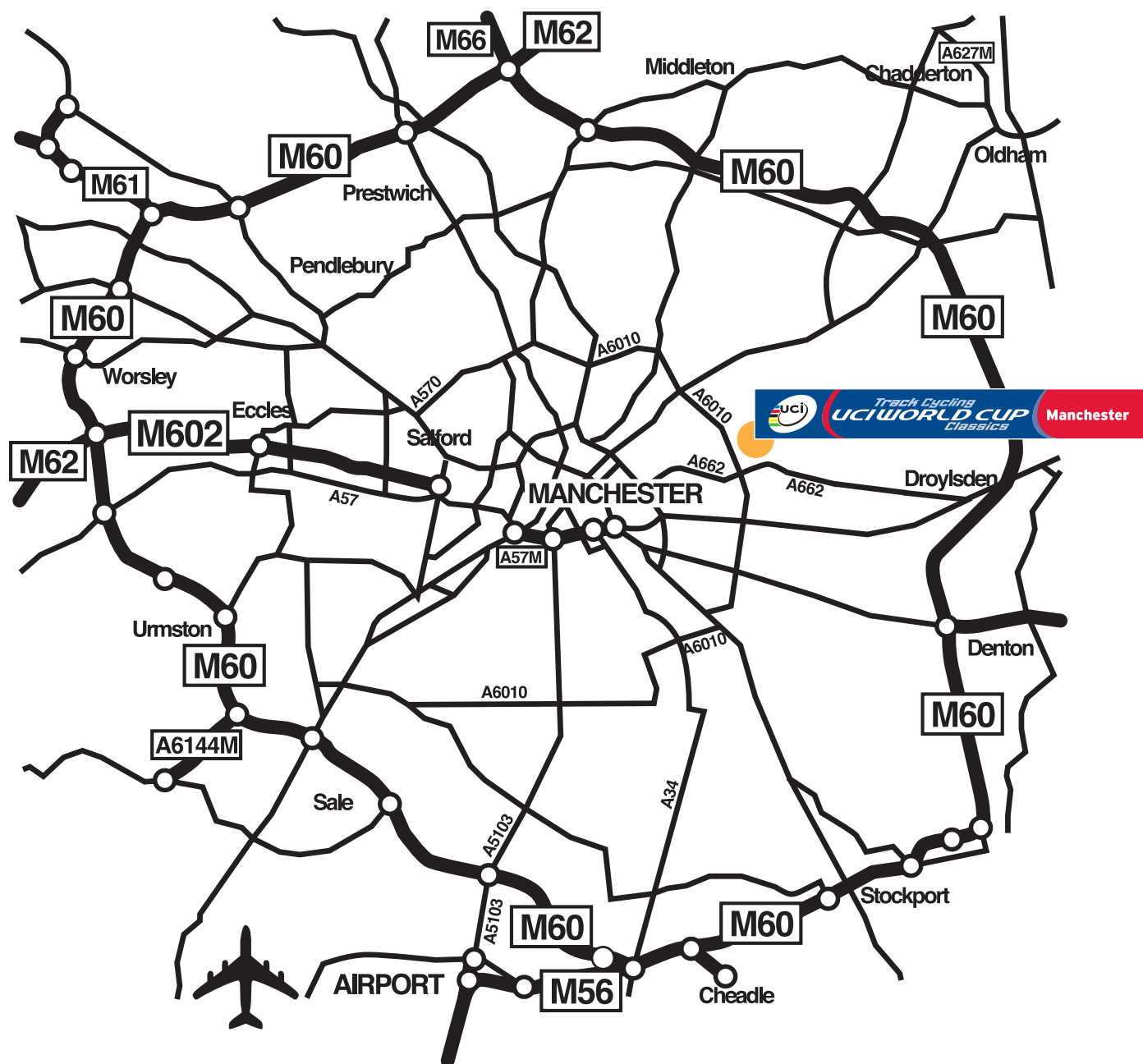

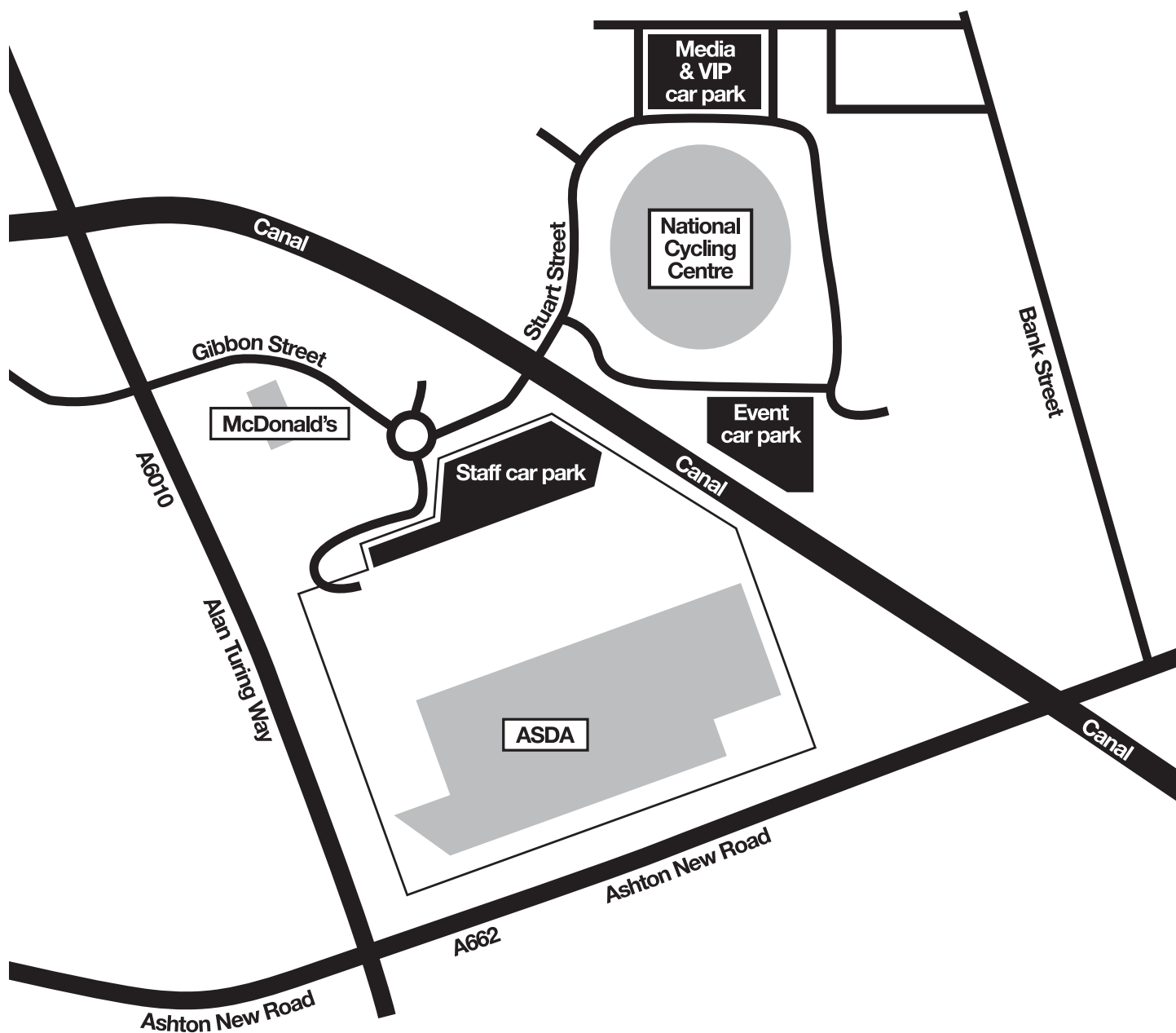
