

^{183}Pb -1

Isomerism was first established in ^{183}Pb by D.G. Jenkins et al. in 1986 at the University of Jyväskylä in Finland the by measuring half-lives of 535(30) ms and 415(20) ms, corresponding to the ground state and an isomeric state, respectively ([2002Je09](#)). Earlier the report of two α -decay energies without a half-life measurement ([1980Sc09](#)) represents the discovery of ^{183}Pb ([2013Fr04](#)).
