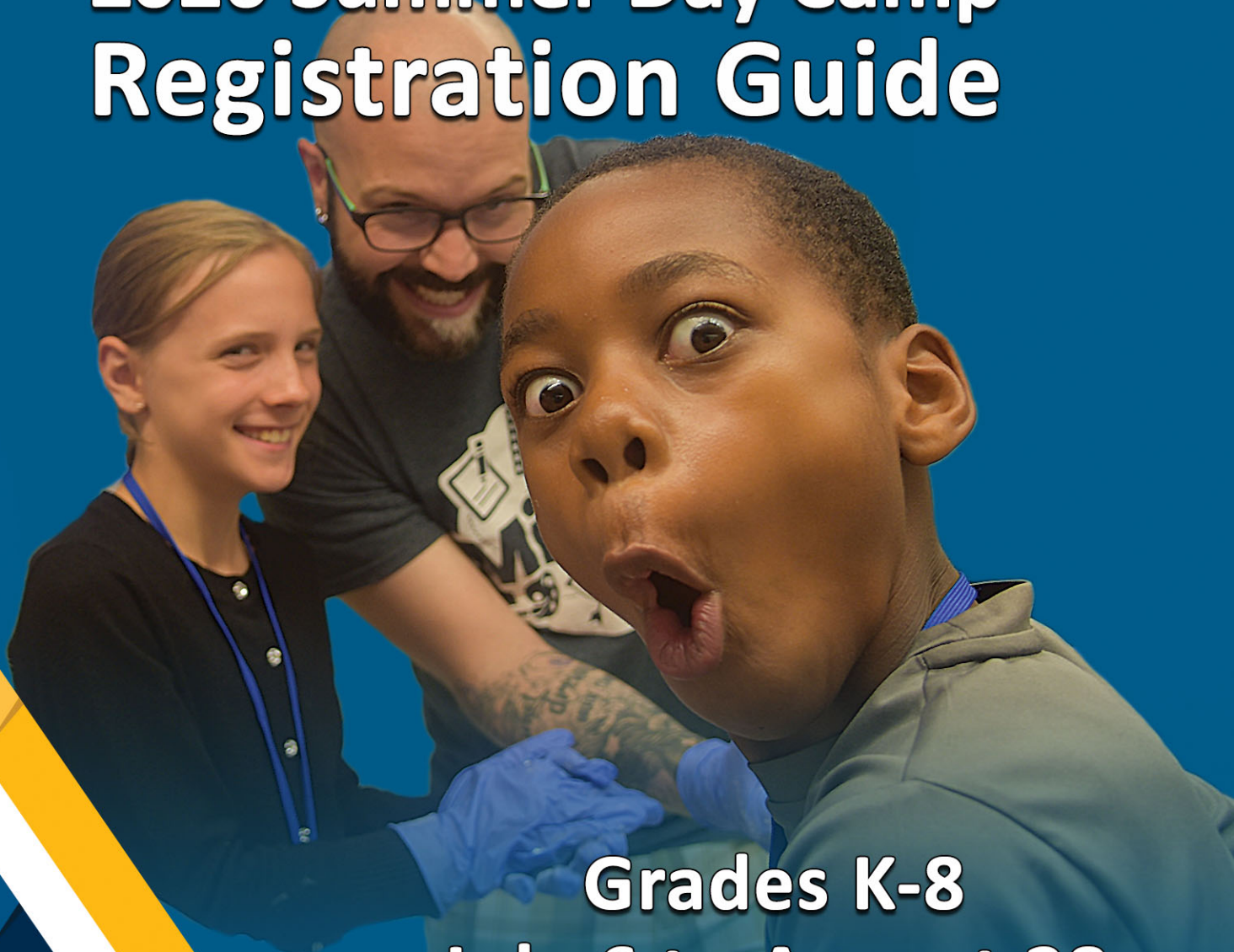

■ HOW TO REGISTER

ONLINE REGISTRATION (OPENS MARCH 16, 2026)

- ◆ To register using our new online system, visit:
miniu.campbrainregistration.com
- ◆ New families: **“New User Sign-Up”**
- ◆ Returning families: Sign in using your username and password from a prior year.
- ◆ If you have registered but do not remember your old password, click “Reset Password”.
- ◆ Enter all required information, make your selections (one or more weeks of camp), and complete waiver form. Repeat for each child you wish to register.
- ◆ See **Payment Options** for next steps.

PAPER REGISTRATION

- ◆ Paper registration forms are normally only available to large community groups and third-party agencies (e.g. Sun Fund, CFS, etc.) upon request.
- ◆ If you would like to request a paper registration package, please contact us at **204-727-7311** or by email at **miniu@brandonu.ca**.
- ◆ You **MUST** provide a valid email address to receive a receipt and other important camp information, including confirmation of enrollment.

REGISTER EARLY FOR THE EARLY BIRD DRAW!

- ◆ **Register and pay in full by May 31** to be entered in the Mini U Early Bird Draw for a chance to win!
- ◆ Draw consists of one \$280 non-transferable, non-refundable credit towards Mini U 2026 registration. (This credit counts towards page 6 discount eligibility.)
- ◆ Limit of one entry per child, per registered program week.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

- ◆ Mini University accepts the following for payment:
 - ◆ **Credit card or EFT via CampBrain.** Please note that credit cards can no longer be taken over the phone.
 - ◆ Cash (in person at Mini U office).
 - ◆ Cheque (in person or by mail; must be made out to **Brandon University** and **CANNOT BE POST-DATED**).

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

- ◆ **Deadline for online registrations is at 12:00 PM on the Thursday before each week begins. Paper registrations must be received by the Tuesday at 4:00 PM.**

REFUND & CAMP CANCELLATION POLICY

- ◆ Refunds, **minus a \$25.00+GST admin fee per camper per week cancelled**, will be given up to 5 business days prior to the start of the cancelled program.
- ◆ For refunds at a later date, a doctor’s certificate must be presented to Mini U within 15 business days of the cancellation date. Lunch program and fees for early drop-off/late pick-up are not refunded in this event.
- ◆ Mini U reserves the right to cancel any programs, courses, or camps. In this unfortunate circumstance, the participant will be notified and either given an alternative option or a full refund.

■ DAILY ROUTINE

DROP-OFF & CHECK-IN

- ◆ Location: Mini University HQ (Room 003, Basement)
Healthy Living Centre
Henry Champ Gym
- ◆ **Regular Drop-Off Hours:** 8:30 AM to 9:00 AM.
- ◆ **Early Drop-Off Hours:** 7:30 AM to 8:30 AM (available for an additional fee: \$20 for 4-day weeks and \$25 for 5-day weeks).
- ◆ On the first day of camp, please check-in by 8:45 AM so campers have time to receive their name tags.
- ◆ If you are not feeling well, please stay home! We want to keep our campers and staff healthy!

LUNCH TIME

- ◆ Participants will be brought to our cafeteria at lunch.
- ◆ Campers may either bring a bag lunch or pre-purchase our optional weekly lunch program (for an additional fee; for pricing and menu, please see pages 6 and 7).
- ◆ Due to time constraints, there will be **NO option to purchase food from the BU cafeteria separately.**
- ◆ **We have a nut free, energy drink free, and fragrance free policy.**

PICK-UP & SIGN-OUT

- ◆ Campers will return to the Healthy Living Centre close to 4:00 PM, and parents must make arrangements for the pick-up/sign-out of their child(ren).
- ◆ **Regular Pick-Up Hours:** 4:00 PM to 4:30 PM
- ◆ **Late Pick-Up Hours:** 4:30 PM to 5:30 PM (for an additional fee: \$20 weekly for 4-day weeks and \$25 weekly for 5-day weeks).
- ◆ **Important: Designated grownups must present photo ID at pick-up time.**
- ◆ During registration, please note if you give permission to someone other than a parent/guardian to pick up your child(ren).
- ◆ During registration, please note if you give permission for your 12+ year-old child(ren) to self-sign-out (i.e. leave unattended).

■ OUR INSTRUCTORS

STAFF TRAINING & BACKGROUND CHECKS

- ◆ Our instructors are chosen for their knowledge, maturity, leadership, and ability to relate to children.
- ◆ The vast majority of our staff are university students or recent graduates, with many studying to become teachers.
- ◆ To ensure we employ only the highest quality staff and instructors, we provide 2 weeks of paid training that includes lesson planning, classroom management, and cultural sensitivity.
- ◆ As well, our instructors are certified in First Aid and CPR, and have clear Criminal Record and Child Abuse Registry Checks.

BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT & 3-STRIKE POLICY

- ◆ Mini U's goal is for its participants to have fun in a safe learning environment. To ensure everyone has the best learning experience possible, we do 3 main things:
 - ◆ **Explain Our Rules:** At the start of camp, camp and classroom rules are explained to all campers. Participants are made aware that behaviours which cause emotional or physical harm, disrupt the camp, or damage facilities or equipment are not tolerated, nor are behaviours such as bullying, racism, sexism, or homophobia.
 - ◆ **Train Our Staff:** As part of our 2 weeks of training, we provide professional development training in classroom and behavioural management techniques and best practices.
 - ◆ **Enforce 3-Strike Policy:** If there is a behavioural issue that cannot be resolved by the classroom instructor, then the camper is brought to either the Team Leader and/or the Program Coordinator for a discussion of the situation. Strike 1 (or an immediate Strike 2 or 3, depending on the severity of behaviour) may be given. On both Strike 1 and 2, the camper's parent or guardian will be notified via conversation at pick-up, phone call, or email. In the rare event Strike 3 is needed, the participant is immediately removed from camp and released to their designated grownup. **No refunds are given in the event of a Strike 3. Campers who attempt to leave camp without permission ('flight risks') are considered an immediate Strike 3 offense.**

■ WHAT TO BRING

THE ESSENTIALS

- ◆ Hat and sunscreen
- ◆ Water bottle (with name on it)
- ◆ Snacks
- ◆ Bagged lunch (or choose the lunch program option)
- ◆ Clothes you don't mind getting dirty or stained
- ◆ Clean, non-marking gym shoes
- ◆ Extra set of clothes

KEEP AT HOME

- ◆ Valuables (Mini U is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged personal items brought to camp).

FUN DAY FRIDAYS—JUNIORS

- ◆ Weather permitting*, every Friday afternoon includes a trip to the Stanley Park spray park for all Junior campers.
- ◆ Please bring a swimsuit and a towel for Fridays.
- ◆ Please note: Friday's pick-up and sign-out will still be at Brandon University.

FUN DAY FRIDAYS—SENIORS

- ◆ Every Friday afternoon, Senior campers will break into teams and participate in a host of fun challenge activities that test both body and mind.



*Mini U cancels outdoor activities at about 32°C (with or without humidex), or during rain, thunderstorms, or smoke.



■ EXPECTATIONS

CAMPER EXPECTATIONS

- ◆ At the beginning of each week, camper rules and expectations will be addressed in front of all campers.
- ◆ Classroom specific expectations will be addressed on Monday at the beginning of each class and as needed throughout the week.
- ◆ Cellphone use is not allowed unless permitted by an instructor.
- ◆ Campers are expected to stay with their group and/or instructor(s) at all times.
- ◆ Campers are to be respectful of themselves, others, and all campus or other property.
- ◆ If a camper is not following these expectations, staff will speak with the camper, and if deemed necessary, strikes may be handed out if the behaviour persists.

DESIGNATED GROWNUP EXPECTATIONS

- ◆ Responsible for ensuring children are dropped off and picked up at designated times.
- ◆ Responsible for presenting photo ID at pick-up.
- ◆ Responsible for sending proper clothing and materials needed for camp.
- ◆ Responsible for ensuring lunch is provided (either bagged lunch or by purchasing our lunch program).
- ◆ If your camper experiences a problem that was not seen or addressed by a staff member, please bring it to our office's attention as soon as possible and in a respectful manner.
- ◆ Provide a respectful and welcoming environment for all campers of all backgrounds.

STAFF EXPECTATIONS

- ◆ Address camp-wide and classroom expectations to all campers.
- ◆ Make all campers feel as though they can bring any concerns to any staff member.
- ◆ Keep all campers safe by addressing camper and/or classroom misbehaviour(s) at time of occurrence.

* Special Week 5 Multi-Week Discount

Each registration for a regular 5-day week (i.e. Weeks 1-4, 6-8) generates one eligibility for a **40% discounted tuition when registering for Week 5**. The discounted Week 5 registration may be used for the same child or for another child within the same household, but is **subject to program age eligibility and available space in Week 5 on a first-come, first-served basis**.

Week 5 tuition is reduced to \$132 from \$220 with this offer.

How It Works (Examples)

- Child A attends Week 2 Junior Moose, and Child B attends Week 1 Senior Mini U. Both children may attend their respective programs in Week 5 at the discounted rate.
- Child A attends Week 8 Senior Mini U. Child B attends Week 5 Senior using the discounted rate.
- Child A attends Weeks 3, 6, and 7. Child A and Child B may each receive one Week 5 registration at the discounted rate. The last discount is unused (unless there is another sibling).

Discounts of any kind cannot be combined on a single registration (e.g. you cannot register a child for Week 1 and Week 2 and receive a 80% discount on one Week 5 registration). Only one discount of any kind may be applied per individual week registration.

Eligibility & Conditions

The qualifying 5-day week registration must be completed, paid according to Mini U's payment policies, and must remain active for the discount to apply. **Note that registrations covered by bursaries do not count towards this discount.**

The discount applies only to the Week 5 (August 4 to 7, 2026) program tuition fee and does not apply to fees for extended care, lunch program, or any other ancillary charges. Discounts have no cash value, cannot be transferred to another season or household, and cannot be applied retroactively. **Groups from remote Indigenous communities are considered to be in the same household for the purposes of this discount.**

Cancellation & Adjustments

If a qualifying 5-day week registration is cancelled, withdrawn, or refunded (in whole or in part) for any reason (including medical reasons), the associated Week 5 discount will be **voided** and the **difference between the discounted rate and the regular Week 5 rate will become immediately due**. Standard cancellation and refund policies apply.

Mini University reserves the right to modify or discontinue this promotion at any time.

■ LUNCH PROGRAM MENU

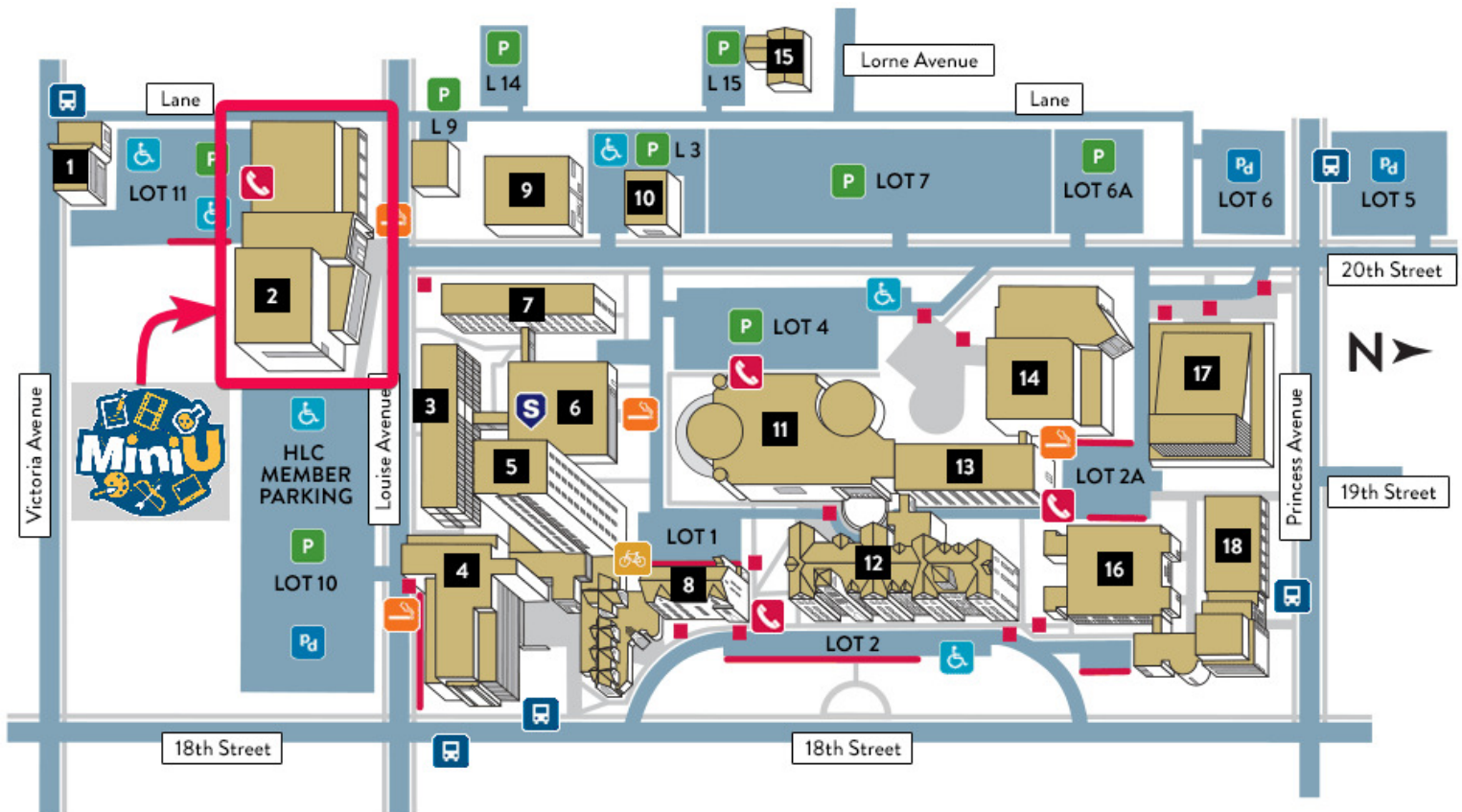

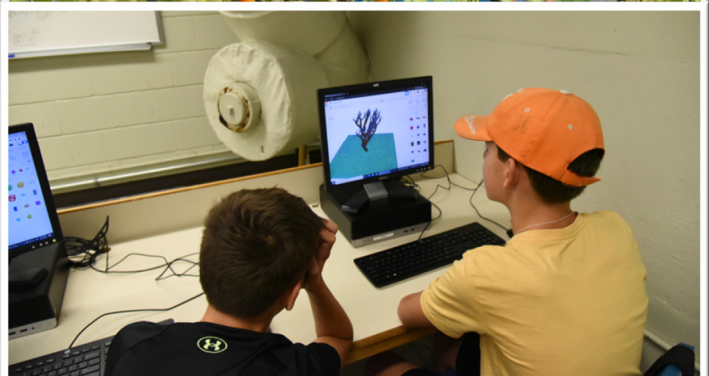

■ SCIENCE

A.I. EXPLORERS

Dive into artificial intelligence concepts like computer vision, machine learning, and generative A.I. with hands-on activities and real A.I. tools.

ANIMAL SCIENCE

Learn about different animals ranging from common household pets to wacky, exotic animals, big and small!

ASTRONOMY

Discover planets, stars, galaxies, and all of the secrets of the night sky. Learn about space travel and theories about possible life on other planets.

CHEMICAL CONCOCTIONS

Explore the science of chemistry and learn about the chemical makeup of substances while performing fizzling and popping experiments.

CLIMATE AND CATASTROPHES

Learn about extreme weather events, climate change, their effects on farming, and conservation efforts.

EXPERIMENTAL

Part experimentation, part play! Get messy as we explore science experiments from a variety of science disciplines.

FLYING MACHINES

Master the principles of flight. Make paper airplanes and protect an egg from a multi-storey parachute drop.

MARBLE RUN ENGINEERING

Work in teams to design and build creative marble runs using recyclables, Micro:bit electronics and motors.

MEDICAL MYSTERY

Discover the everyday challenges facing medical personnel. Also find out how the human body works through activities like the dissection of animal organs.

OUR EARTH

Learn to identify rocks, minerals, and gems from Earth's crust and explore the prehistory of humankind.

SPY KIDS

Train to use real-world espionage methods and create (and crack) secret codes through cryptography.

■ COMPUTER SCIENCE

3D CREATORS

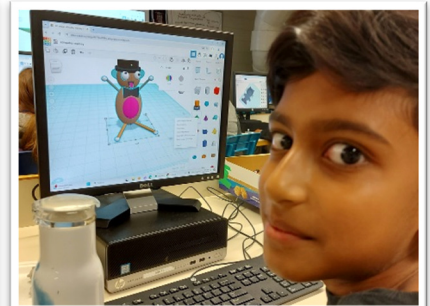
PROGRAM OVERVIEW
