A. Davidovich Fokina | Age: 28 | World No. 22 | Career-High No. 14 | 2026: 13-11 (Adelaide SF) | Stuttgart: 0-0 (Debut)

> Made Top 20 debut in July 2025 and achieved career-high No. 14 in November 2025 following his run to 5th ATP Tour final in Basel after previously peaking at No. 21 in 2023.

> Broke Djokovic 9 times in Monte-Carlo 2R win, setting record for most breaks of Djokovic in a best-of-3-set match to defeat then-World No. 1 en route to 1st ATP Tour final of career at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo.

> Advanced to 1st Grand Slam QF at 2021 Roland Garros and 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2021 Monte-Carlo, highlighted by 5-set win over Ruud in Roland Garros 3R.

> In 2025, advanced to 4 ATP Tour finals, including Delray Beach, where he held 2 championship points vs. Kecmanovic, and Washington, where he squandered 3 championship points vs. de Minaur.

> Ended junior career as World No. 2 after winning Wimbledon boys' singles title and posting 20-1 record in 2017.

NOTE: Davidovich Fokina bids to be the first Spanish match winner at this event since F. Lopez in 2021 (d. Popyrin). 28-year-old went 5-2 on grass last year, advancing to Eastbourne SF and Wimbledon 3R, losing to No. 5 Fritz twice, and 10-0 vs. left-handers last season, but is 1-4 against them in 2026, including loss to Bellucci in Acapulco 2R.

Mattia Bellucci | Age: 25 | World No. 78 | Career-High No. 63 | 2026: 5-10 (Acapulco QF) | Stuttgart: 0-0 (Debut)

> Began 2022 season as No. 681 on PIF ATP Rankings, broke in Top 500 in April, Top 200 in October and ended the year as No. 154, before breaking in Top 100 in November 2024 and achieving career-high No. 63 in July 2025.

> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF at 2024 Atlanta as Q and defeated No. 7 Medvedev and No. 12 Tsitsipas for biggest wins of career en route to 1st SF at 2025 Rotterdam.

> Made tour-level debut at 2023 Australian Open as Q, then qualified Roland Garros and Wimbledon and US Open in 2024, defeating former champion Wawrinka in US Open 1R for 1st Grand Slam win.

> Owns 76-69 Challenger record (4-4 in finals), winning titles at 2022 Saint-Tropez as No. 275-ranked Q and 2022 Vilnius in back-to-back weeks before capturing 2023 Cassis and 2025 Sumter.

NOTE: Bellucci is 5-12 vs. Top 30, including win over No. 25 Lehecka in Wimbledon 2R last year (1-1 on grass) and earned wins this season over No. 14 Davidovich Fokina in Acapulco 2R and No. 26 Etcheverry in Rome 2R. Last week, played in his 1st grass-court match of the season at Birmingham Challenger, losing to Bolt in 1R as No. 1 seed.

[Q] Pierre-Hugues Herbert (FRA) vs Martin Landaluce (ESP) **First Meeting**

Pierre-Hugues Herbert | Age: 35 | World No. 232 | Career-High No. 36 | 2026: 0-2 (2x 1R) | Stuttgart: 1-4 (2025 2R)

> Former Top-40 singles player defeated No. 5 Tsitsipas for biggest win of career en route to 4th ATP Tour singles final at 2021 Marseille.

> Advanced to ATP Tour finals of 2015 Winston-Salem, 2016 Shenzhen and 2019 Montpellier and reached singles Grand Slam 3R at 2016 Australian Open, 2016 Wimbledon, 2018 Roland Garros and 2019 Australian Open.

> Formed strong doubles team with countryman Mahut, who is 9 years older, that led to his career-high No. 2 doubles ranking in 2016.

> One of 8 teams to complete career Grand Slam in doubles, winning titles at 2015 US Open, 2016 Wimbledon, 2018 Roland Garros, 2019 Australian Open and 2021 Roland Garros.

> Captured Nitto ATP Finals doubles titles in 2019 and 2021 after squandering championship point in 2018 and qualifying in 2015-17.

> Frenchmen boast 21-8 team record in tour-level doubles finals, including 7-2 at ATP Masters 1000s with 7 different titles.

NOTE: Herbert defeated Glinka in Q1 and Alkaya in Q2 without dropping a set to enter Stuttgart main draw as a qualifier for the third consecutive year. 35-year-old seeks first tour-level win since defeating Dzumhur in Stuttgart 1R last year (0-6 since), including losses this year in Doha to Royer and Roland Garros to Sonego.

Martin Landaluze | Age: 20 | World No. 58 (Career-High) | 2026: 9-5 (2 QFs) | Stuttgart: 0-0 (Debut)

> Former World No. 1 junior earned 1st ranking point in 2023, broke into Top 200 in 2024 and Top 100 in April 2026 and achieved career-high No. 58 in June 2026 after run to Roland Garros 3R.

> Defeated countryman Munar for 1st ATP Tour win at 2024 Miami as WC, becoming 1st player born in 2006 or later to win an ATP Masters 1000 match and first to advance to ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2026 Miami as Q.

> Entered 2026 Rome as a lucky loser with 0-8 ATP Tour record on clay, advancing to his second ATP Masters 1000 QF without dropping a set.

> Made his professional debut at 2022 Alicante CH a week before his ATP Tour debut at 2022 Gijon as WC and qualified for Grand Slam main draw debut at 2025 Australian Open.

> Owns 73-53 Challenger record (2-0 in finals), winning titles at 2024 Olbia and 2025 Orleans.

> Posted 58-8 record on junior circuit in 2022, including a 15-match winning streak on grass before losing in Wimbledon boys' singles SF, then captured 2022 US Open boys' singles title.

NOTE: Landaluze is playing in his first ATP Tour match on grass courts but went 8-4 on the surface across all levels last season, including runs to Nottingham-2 CH semi-finals (l. to Cilic) and Wimbledon final round of qualifying (l. to Bolt). 20-year-old is No. 3 on PIF ATP Next Gen Race, only trailing No. 1 Jodar and No. 2 Fonseca.

Roman Safiullin | Age: 28 | World No. 135 | Career-High No. 36 | 2026: 0-1 (Roland Garros 1R) | Event: 0-2 ('24-'25 1R)

> Former World No. 2 junior broke into Top 100 in August 2022 and achieved career-high No. 36 in January 2024.

> Posted personal-best 20 wins in 2023, highlighted by 1st ATP Tour final in Chengdu and win over No. 2 Alcaraz at ATP Masters 1000 Paris to reach 3R as Q.

> In his Wimbledon main draw debut as World No. 92 in 2023, became lowest-ranked quarter-finalist since Kyrgios in 2014.

> Defeated 2-time champion and World No. 4 Tsitsipas to reach 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 Marseille, and advanced to 2nd SF at 2022 Tel Aviv.

> Went on a 16-1 run in April-May 2026, winning back-to-back Challenger titles at Oeiras-3 as Q and Mauthausen and qualifying for Roland Garros.

> Went 105-21 with 11 titles on ITF Junior Circuit, posting wins over Medvedev, Rublev and Khachanov before ending junior career as 2015 Australian Open champion.

NOTE: Safiullin entered the draw as a lucky loser (l. to Galarneau in Q2) after No. 5 seed Paul withdrew due to neck issue. 28-year-old aims to record first tour-level win since defeating No. 49 Monfils in US Open 1R in August last year.

G. Mpetshi Perricard | Age: 22 | World No. 93 | Career-High No. 29 | 2026: 6-12 (2 QFs) | Stuttgart: 1-2 (2025 2R)

> Began 2024 season as No. 205 and broke into Top 100 in May, Top 50 in July and achieved career-high No. 29 in February 2025.

> Recorded 6-1 start to career vs. Top 20 opponents, including wins over former champion No. 19 Auger-Aliassime and No. 14 Rune to win 2024 Basel title without dropping serve all tournament (60 of 60 service games won).

> Saved a championship point to win 1st ATP Tour title in his hometown of Lyon in 2024 as No. 117-ranked WC.

> Entered 2024 Wimbledon as LL, defeating No. 21 Korda in 1R for 1st Grand Slam main draw win en route to becoming 1st lucky loser to reach Wimbledon 4R since Norman in 1995.

> Owns 56-34 Challenger record (5-0 in finals), winning titles at 2023 Leon, 2024 Nottingham, 2024 Cuernavaca, 2024 Acapulco and 2025 Bordeaux.

> Peaked at No. 4 in junior rankings during 2021 season, after advancing to 2021 Roland Garros boys' singles SF (l. to Fils) and winning the boys' doubles title w/Fils.

NOTE: Mpetshi Perricard is playing in Stuttgart for the third consecutive year and aims to advance to 2R for the second time. Frenchman went 1-3 on grass last season, defeating Safiullin in Stuttgart 1R for lone win.
