Marco Trungelliti (ARG) vs Mariano Navone (ARG)

First Meeting

Marco Trungelliti | Age: 36 | World No. 78 | Career-High No. 76 | 2026: 4-6 (Marrakech Final) | Geneva: 0-0 (Debut)
> Broke into Top 200 in 2012 and Top 100 at career-high No. 76 in April 2026 at age 36 to be the oldest man that debuted in Open Era to break inside Top 100 for the first time, following run to Marrakech final.
> Qualified and advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2018 Umag, 2nd QF at 2019 Sao Paulo and 1st final at 2026 Marrakech as Q, becoming oldest first-time ATP Tour finalist after ousting No. 19 Darderi in SF.
> Also qualified 8 times at Grand Slams, including 2016 Roland Garros, where he earned biggest win of career over No. 10 Cilic in 1R.
> Drove 10 hours from Barcelona to Paris with his grandmother Daphne after receiving LL spot at 2018 Roland Garros, then defeated Tomic in 1R.
> Owns 276-216 Challenger record and is 7-11 in Challenger finals (after 2-10 start), winning titles at 2018 Barletta, 2019 Florence, 2024 Kigali-2, 2025 Lyon, 2025 Tulln, 2025 Targu Mures and 2026 Kigali-2.

NOTE: Trungelliti earned all 4 tour-level wins this season by reaching his 1st ATP Tour final in Marrakech and now seeks third Top 50 win of 2026 (6-10 vs. Top 50 in career) after beating No. 32 Moutet & No. 19 Darderi in Marrakech. He is playing in his 30th tour-level event, 4th as a direct entry after 2016 Bastad, 2019 Sao Paulo and 2026 Rome.

Mariano Navone | Age: 25 | World No. 44 | Career-High No. 29 | 2026: 11-11 (Bucharest Title) | Geneva: 0-0 (Debut)
> Broke into Top 200 in June 2023, Top 100 in February 2024 and Top 50 in April 2024, achieving career-high No. 29 in June 2024 after capturing 6th Challenger title in Cagliari.
> As No. 31 seed at 2024 Roland Garros, became 1st man in the Open Era to be seeded in his Grand Slam main draw debut and defeated former-World No. 10 Carreno Busta in 1R.
> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2026 Bucharest, saving 2 match points vs. van de Zandschulp in SF, and earning deciding set wins in 3 out of 5 matches, after finals at 2024 Rio de Janeiro and 2024 Bucharest.
> On home soil, made his ATP Tour debut at 2024 Cordoba as WC and earned 1st Top 20 win over No. 12 Rune to reach 2025 Buenos Aires QF before squandering 2 MPs vs. eventual champion Fonseca.
> Posted 40-18 Challenger record in 2023, ending the season on a 19-2 run and led all players with 5 Challenger titles, winning in Poznan, Santa Fe, Santa Cruz, Buenos Aires and Santa Fe-2.

NOTE: Navone is 10-6 on tour-level clay in 2026, highlighted by winning his 1st ATP Tour title in Bucharest and run to 1st ATP Masters 1000 3R in Rome last week after defeating No. 5 Auger-Aliassime for his 1st Top 10 win. He bids to be the third Argentine to win a main draw match in Geneva in this decade after Delbonis in 2022 and Baez in 2024.
